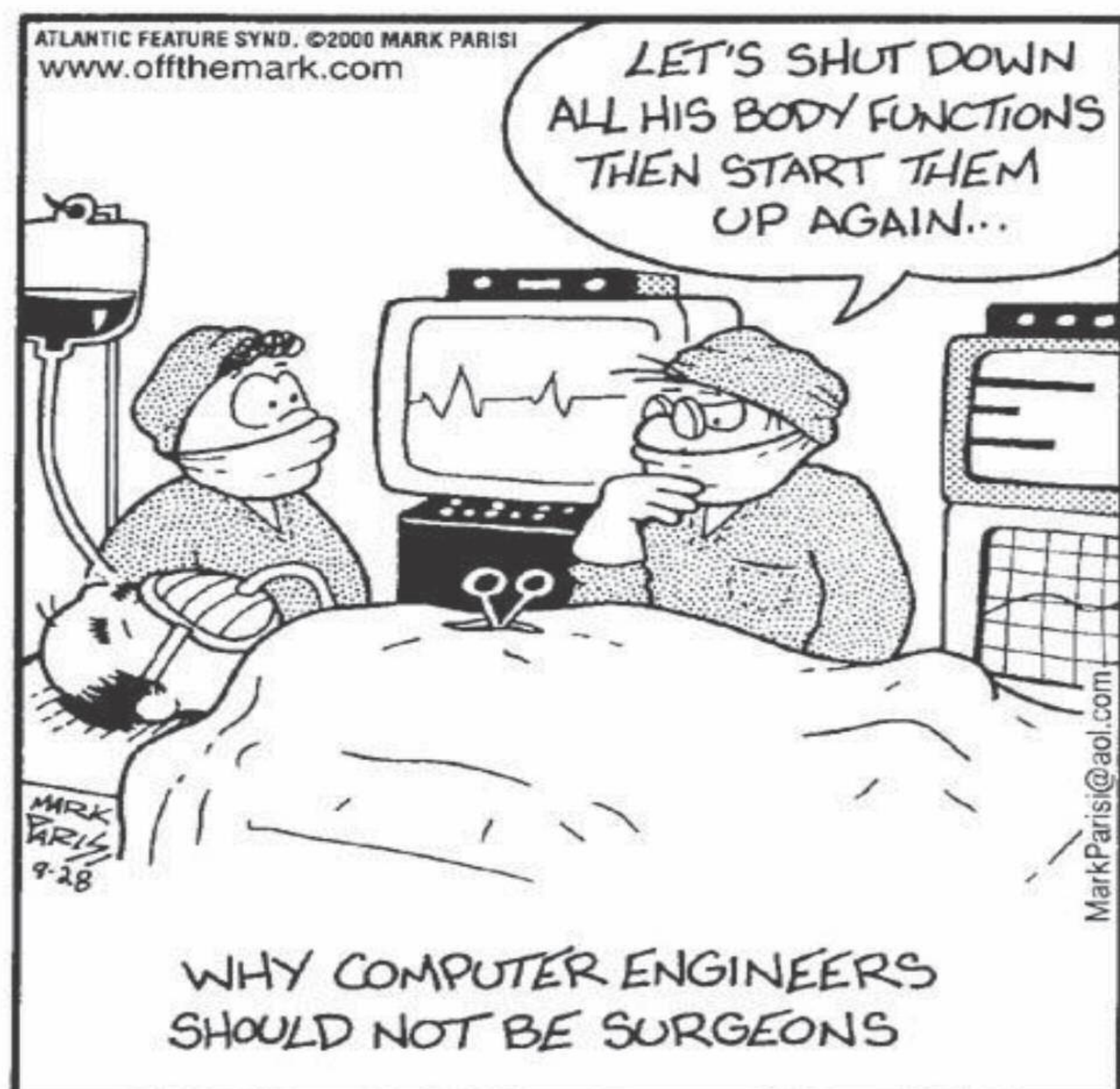
The Secretary, **Ms. Nitika Thakur**, handles well and is cooperative with everyone.

Overpriced Food during Movies

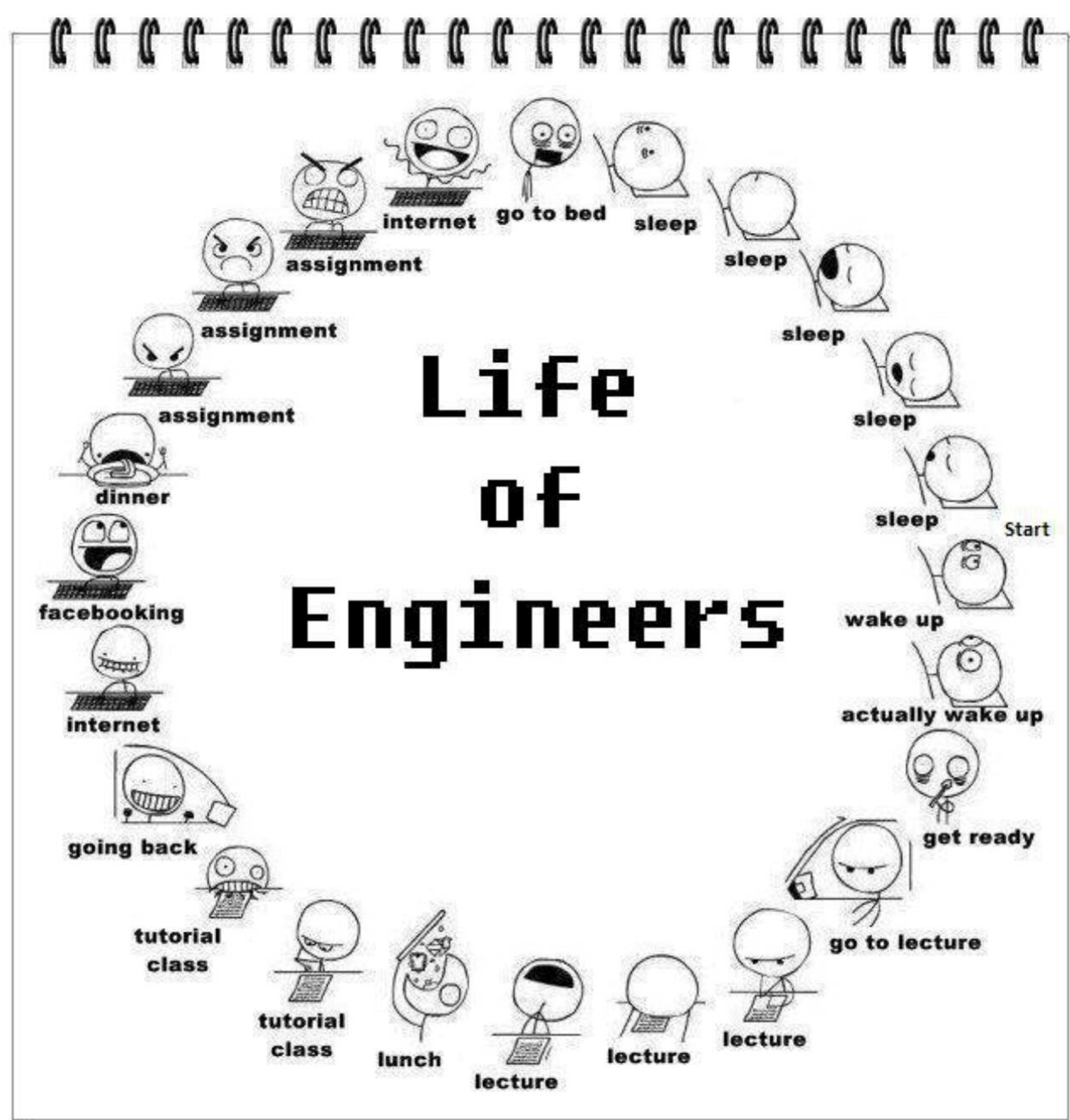
