Incipere 2021 was indeed the moment when all the members of Synapse could feel what Irving Berlin once said, "The song has ended but the music lingers on", as the office bearers passed on their legacy to the new team, to build a new song on the melody of SYNAPSE, the club of the Department of Biotechnology and Bioinformatics.

With its inception in 2004, the Team Synapse has always started its tenure with Incipere, the first annual event for the department, which marks the beginning of a new session with the welcoming of a new team and the farewell of the old one.

Although, the year 2020 had been very different from all others, with the ongoing global pandemic of COVID-19, this yearly celebration had been delayed. But 2021 made sure to make up for the lost time, with Incipere-2021 being held on March 27, 2021. More than 100 participants attended the event on the Google Meet platform.

The event was marked by the presence of esteemed faculties of JUIT, including the Dean of Academics, Prof (Dr.) Samir Dev Gupta, Head of Department of Biotechnology and Bioinformatics, Prof. (Dr.) Sudhir Kumar, and various other faculty members and faculty coordinators of Synapse, Dr. Hemant Sood and Dr. Tiratha Raj Singh.

The program started with a brief introduction about Synapse by B.Tech third year students, Janki Insan and Simran Gohan. The students clearly defined the purpose of formation of Synapse as not only to push students towards academic excellence but also to encourage and help them develop their extra-curricular skills while still using their knowledge and to prepare them better for the competitive world both in laboratory and the corporate sector.

Prof (Dr.) Samir Dev Gupta enlightened the students with his kind words of inspiration. He welcomed the freshers and congratulated them on joining the department of BT-BI, which he explained, is considered as one of the most advanced departments in terms of research and laboratory activities, besides having an enthusiastic and excellent faculty. His motivational speech was followed by a short musical video performance by third year B.Tech students, Shubhangi and Kanishk. Their performance was so engrossing that the students and faculties couldn't stop themselves from appreciating and clapping for them in the virtual mode.

Next, Prof. (Dr.) Sudhir Kumar, HoD of Biotechnology and Bioinformatics, encouraged the students and faculties with his kind words. He complimented the students, faculties and alumni of the department and also extended his words of praise to the old and new team members of Synapse. He applauded the club as being a modest but extremely active one. The club, he said, had always beamed with positivity and ardor which was quite evident even today as he expressed his admiration towards the club for conducting the Incipere-2021 in the virtual mode which he explained was although, challenging but extremely well executed.

None the less, the faculties also seemed to be satisfied and happy when the students gave the right answers every time.

Dr. Hemant Sood, the faculty coordinator for Synapse, was called on next, to share her experience and to announce the winners of Article Writing Competition, the last activity conducted by the team of Synapse-2019. Dr. Sood, went on to explain the beautiful balance made by clubs between academics, research and hobbies. She welcomed all the freshers to their college, their "second home". She highlighted the various events conducted by the team of Synapse.

Even when the world was in a phase of lockdown and all was shut, the webinars conducted by Synapse in association with the alumni who are all at respectable positions in their careers, either pursuing higher studies or settled in some good companies, gave a great insight to the current students on the paths they wish to follow in their life. The team, she said, had conducted various such events in the times of virtual life, and had therefore created a big landmark. She concluded by quoting the Nobel Prize winner for Chemistry, Dr. Jennifer Doudna, "Go for your biggest and most exciting idea and don't let anybody tell you that it won't work", which indeed inspired the students.

Dr. Sood went on to share the names of winners of Scientific Article Writing Competition held on the occasion of National Science Day, on the topic, "Skill development in biotechnology and/or bioinformatics". Shanjzi Dsilva bagged the first place, while Amrita Mishra and Ishita received the second and third places respectively. This marked the end of the last event conducted by the team of Synapse-2019.

It's a well-known fact that a team is as good as its leader. On behalf of the president of Synapse-2019, Sugam Singh, Khushi Maheshwari, the Arts and Cultural coordinator was called upon to share her experience. "It is a well-known fact that volunteering is a fantastic way to gain new skills in a host of different areas". Khushi went on to express her gratitude towards the faculty members, the committee members, the students and the department and college on a whole, on behalf of all the team members, for making Synapse more successful in its endeavors by showing their active participation in all the events organized, which pushed the team to do better every time.

A short video of the Team Synapse played next to sum up the activities conducted by the club and its role in the department. It highlighted all the different activities conducted by the club ranging from its active participation in conducting the International Conference on Recent Trends in Biotechnology and Bioinformatics, to Incipere, the annual departmental event to welcome the freshers and introduce the new team of Synapse for the current academic session, Cidering, the wine making competition, Biomodelling, to unleash the artist inside and amalgamate it with the knowledge gained to create a model of scientific understanding, Voice for BT, the intercollegiate speech contest on biotechnology, various career events including guest lectures from expert faculties of both industry and academia, webinars with the alumni of JUIT on the various options of work and life and various industrial visits to familiarize the students with the industry, its organization and the practical perspective to theoretical knowledge.

Janki Insan, the chief editor of "Atavism", the student run Synapse Newsletter, gave a brief overview of the same. The bi-monthly newsletter, she explained, was entirely written, edited and managed by the students. It covered the latest trends in biotechnology and bioinformatics including some bizarre headlines and interesting facts in comical format. It provides a wonderful opportunity to students to write design and draw the scientific knowledge in accordance with their own creativities and insights. She further explained the importance of contributions of students to the newsletter and modes by which they could be involved with the same.

The program concluded with a short speech of Dr. Tiratha Raj Singh, the faculty coordinator of Synapse and faculty in-charge media relations. He congratulated the "dynamic team" of Synapse for their efforts and taking the club to "greater heights" and mentioned the contributions of the current office bearers in the club. Dr. Tiratha moved on to further announce the names of the new Club heads and coordinators.
