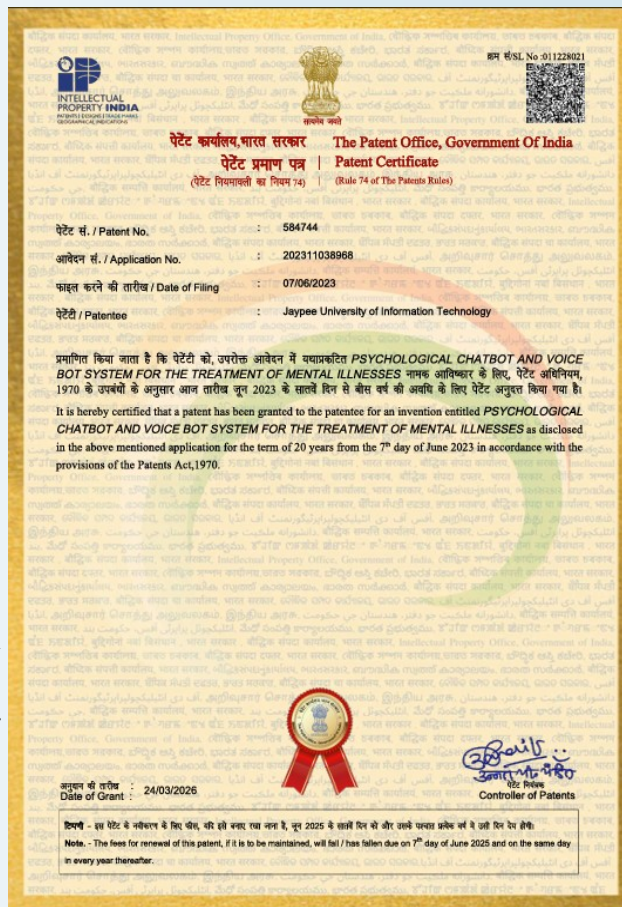

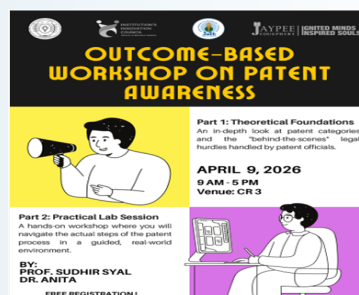


Regional and National Impact with Future Vision :

On 9th April 2026, the IPR Cell organized an Outcome-based workshop on Patent Awareness and Patent Filing. The workshop provided participants with an overview of the patent lifecycle, including patent categories, filing procedures, and examination processes. It comprised two parts: a theoretical session covering the fundamentals of patents and legal procedures, followed by a practical lab session demonstrating patent searching



and filing processes. The workshop was informative and helped participants' understanding of intellectual property rights and patent filing procedures.

AN AI ODYSSEY

JUIT, under the visionary leadership of Honorable CEO Manu Bhaskar Gaur Ji, successfully organized an innovative AI-based competition titled “JUIT: An AI Odys-



sey.” The event aimed to merge artificial intelligence with creative storytelling through the theme “Make the User a Part of the JUIT Story through AI Characters & Interactive Storytelling.” Participants were encouraged

to create immersive AI-driven experiences showcasing “A Day in the Life at JUIT.” The competition attracted enthusiastic participation from undergraduate, post-graduate, and doctoral students, with 20 teams registered for the event. Participants developed interactive prototypes using advanced AI tools such as ElevenLabs, Midjourney, Runway, Unity, and web-based frameworks. The competition emphasized creativity, technical implementation, interactivity, and storytelling quality.

After multiple evaluation phases, five teams qualified for the final showcase. The final assessment was conducted by a distinguished panel comprising Prof. Tiratha Raj Singh, Dr. Hari Singh, and Mr. Saurav Kumar Singh. The Cognitive Creators Team secured first position, followed by Jaadoo Team, while Llama 4.0 and RajmaChawal jointly received third position. The event was concluded in April, 2026.

SAP BTP AWARENESS SESSION HIGHLIGHTS EMERGING CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

JUIT organized an awareness session titled “Launch Your Tech Career with SAP BTP,” delivered by Mr. Vikash Kumar (SAP BTP DevOps & AI Manager, Bluestonex; Top 100 in the UK; Times Square featured), a distinguished JUIT alumnus, on April 23, 2026. The session aimed to familiarize students with SAP technologies and their growing relevance in the global industry. During the session, Mr. Kumar explained that SAP serves as the backbone of modern enterprises, supporting key functions such as finance, supply chain management, and human resources. He highlighted that a significant portion of global commerce relies on SAP systems, underscoring its importance in today’s business landscape. The discussion also covered the transition from traditional on-premise systems to cloud-based platforms like SAP Business Technology Platform (BTP), which provide enhanced scalability and



operational efficiency. The role of artificial intelligence in improving automation and decision-making was another key highlight.

Emphasizing industry trends, the speaker pointed out the increasing demand for SAP BTP professionals due to a widening skill gap driven by rapid technological advancements and a shortage of trained experts.

BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN RESEARCH AND A GOOD RESEARCH PROPOSAL

A lecture was organized on 20th April 2026 at 11:00 AM in the DLC for faculty members. The session was delivered by AICTE Distinguished Professor Dr. Tejo Prakash from TIET, Patiala, on the topic “Bridging the Gap between Research and a Good Research Proposal.” Dr. Tejo Prakash visited the university as an external supervisor for the Research Proposal Defense Seminar (RPDS) of Ms. Tuba Khan, a Ph.D. scholar from the Department of Biotechnology & Bioinformatics. Looking into competitive project awards, and the time constraints with the reviewers, he highlighted the importance of a good, crisp, and non-ambiguous title with a candid abstract. These two things will be an important decisive factor for the reviewer to explore the project further. He projected that government bodies are more likely to provide grants to researchers who demonstrate strong and realistic collaborations with associated expertise in the area. The session concluded with an engaging interaction with faculty members on framing objectives, problem statements, and the role of collaborators. Prof. Tejo had a second session with undergraduate students on Capstone Projects and Internships. He highlighted the importance of cross-disciplinary team building and nurturing the ideas through these projects. He

projected Smart India Hackathons and various Govt announcements as key indicators for selecting challenging problems to formulate project ideas.

In the context of internships, he advised students to make the best use of their summer breaks to pursue internships. He further mentioned that this is the time when they can show their worth to companies and treat it as a pre-placement offer. He highlighted the importance of technical documentation, discipline, and skill enhancement through internships. Students shared their viewpoints,

INNOVATEX SESSION ON REMOTE SENSING AND GIS

The InnovateX session on “Remote Sensing and GIS Systems” was successfully conducted by ICP Crewsphere JUIT on the occasion of World Creativity and Innovation Day, April 21, 2026. The session aimed to introduce participants to the fundamentals of remote sensing, Geographic Information Systems (GIS), and their real-world applications.



lyzes spatial data into meaningful layers such as maps, population data, and risk zones. The analogy of remote sensing as “eyes” and GIS as the “brain” helped participants clearly understand their relationship and importance. The session also covered the workflow pipeline involved in transforming raw satellite data into actionable insights. This included data collection, preprocessing, organization, analysis, mapping, and decision-making. Special emphasis was given to the role of Python, where libraries like rasterio, geopandas, matplotlib, and scikit-learn help automate processes, manage large datasets, and enable AI-based predictions.

The session explored how weather forecasting is supported by these technologies, where satellite data is used to predict rainfall, storm paths, and environmental conditions. The importance of these systems in public safety, agriculture, and disaster preparedness was highlighted.

An innovative perspective was presented by connecting GIS and remote sensing with astronomy. The discussion showed how similar techniques are used to map planetary surfaces and analyze space data.

The discussion showed how similar techniques are used to map planetary surfaces and analyze space data. The idea of predictive GIS, where AI and historical data are used to forecast future conditions, was introduced as a forward-looking concept.

The session began with an introduction to remote sensing, explaining how data and images are collected from satellites and telescopes. It highlighted how sensors capture different types of energy, such as visible, infrared, and radar signals, where each pixel represents valuable information about Earth or space. Further, the concept of GIS was explained as a system that organizes and ana-

UTILIZATION OF BIOGAS REACTOR FOR TEA PREPARATION AS A SUSTAINABLE ALTERNATIVE DURING LPG SHORTAGE

Amid the ongoing shortage of LPG cylinders resulting from current scenario, the two out of four biogas reactors of JUIT were effectively utilized as a sustainable alternative energy source for tea preparation. From 24 March onwards, the biogas stove consistently supported the preparation of partial tea requirement twice a day, thereby demonstrating its practical applicability and efficiency in meeting essential needs during this emergent situation. One biogas reactor is near worker’s mess and other is near pantry of Civil Engineering department.



WORLD INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY DAY

Since 26 April, World Intellectual Property Day, the activities were spread across the month as part of an extended IPR Month. In the beginning of April, JUIT IPR team planned multiple activities for the month. Dr. Anita took lead and beautifully elaborated various types



of patent types and procedures to participants. This set the tone for workshop of 09 April. During this workshop, undergraduate, post graduate and Ph.D. students

engaged in hands-on exercises using keywords to search patents and understand the steps involved in patent filing. The outcome of workshop was encouraging, and 10 students came forward with unique ideas. We also made efforts to reach out to students directly through awareness sessions on 23 April during regular classes and labs. These sessions were conducted by Dr. Aman Sharma and Dr. Anita Sardana on the concepts of IPR and elaborated on its various forms, including patents, copyrights, trademarks, and industrial designs, while emphasizing the importance of hands-on training with a final goal of protecting Intellectual assets for them as inventors and for JUIT as an academic institution.

EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO INTEGRATED MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY REHABILITATION CENTRE, SOLAN

Educational visit was organized on Monday, 16 March 2026 for B.Tech. Final year students enrolled in the elective course, Genetic Counselling. As part of the curriculum, Muscular Dystrophy constitutes an important topic, and the visit was planned to provide students with practical exposure and a deeper understanding of the clinical aspects associated with this disorder. DONATION DRIVE AT SHANTI NIKETAN

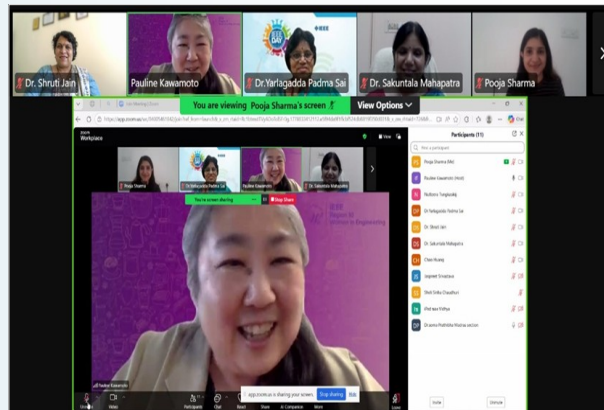
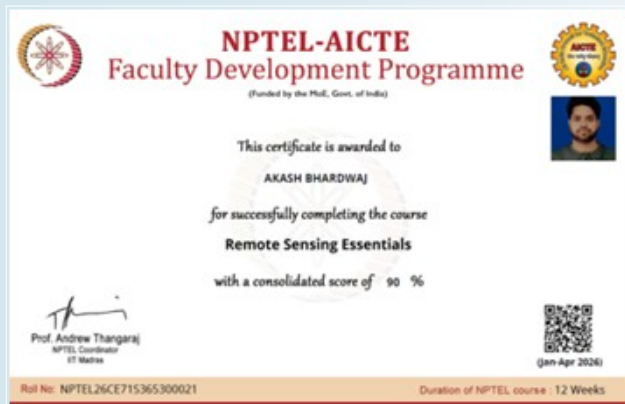
